10 POINT PLAN TO GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION

1. Treat Gun Violence as a health epidemic.
2. Influence others that Violence is not the answer to solve conflicts.
3. Educate our community with conflict resolution, and de-escalation skills.
4. Break the cycle of violence by offering alternatives to improve our quality-of-life issues.
5. Support athletics and other cultural activities that provide enrichment for our young people.
6. Foster educational and mentoring programs that encourage self-esteem and to value human lives.
7. Partner with schools to develop educational programs focused on violence prevention and self-awareness.
8. Utilize the collection of violent incident data to help plan strategies that are culturally aligned within our communities.
9. Connect at risk community members with appropriate services that provide social, emotional, and mental health support.
10. Collaborate outreach approaches with local and federal government agencies, private businesses, faith-based groups, and non-profit organizations.
